Camp Etiquette

To provide a safe training environment for our students, and to maintain a disciplined structure of courtesy and respect, all camp participants are asked to adhere to the following etiquette guidelines.

- Uniforms (gis): All participants are asked to wear a full Karate gi, consisting of a jacket (top), pants and belt. Any T-Shirts worn under the jacket should be tucked into the pants. Male students should also wear appropriate groin protection.
- NECKF Camps are always active workouts. Please plan on attending as a participant and NOT as an observer.
- Each camp instructor will introduce his assistants prior to beginning his section of the camp. These assistants should be the only ones assisting the instructor. That is, unless specifically requested to do so no participant should assume the role of a teacher during a camp. NECKF instructors and teachers should refer any questions to the camp instructor and his/her assistants.
- Proper titles (such as Sir or Ma'am) should be used when addressing camp instructors and their assistants. If the instructor or an assistant answers a question or provides a student with assistance, it is appropriate to respond with a "Thank you, Sir/Ma'am." Please note, camp instructors and their assistants are more likely to assist participants demonstrating proper etiquette than participants who do not.
- If you must arrive late or leave early please contact the camp coordinators in advance.
- To avoid distractions, please don't continuously walk in and out of a training session in progress.
- Respect for one's training partner should be constantly demonstrated through the proper use of physical control.
- If requested to assist an instructor in a demonstration, the proper etiquette is to:
 - Salute in to the instructor
 - Demonstrate proper attitude and technique during the drill
 - Salute out to the instructor upon the completion of the drill.

Finally, NECKF Black Belt students must understand that they can only further their knowledge and skill of American Parker Kenpo through a single systematic training curriculum developed by a qualified instructor. Camps, when approved and recommended by a student's instructor, may add information to what is being taught in the classroom, but they cannot replace a systematic curriculum.
